To honour his memory, she has committed to walking 874 miles – the distance of Land's End to John O'Groats – in only six months, in what she calls 'My Walk for Dad'. Sheryl began her journey in January of 2021 and aims to finish in June, on her father's birthday.

Pete's 11-year-old granddaughter is also walking for her granddad every day. The walks have been something for the family to focus on during this difficult time.
